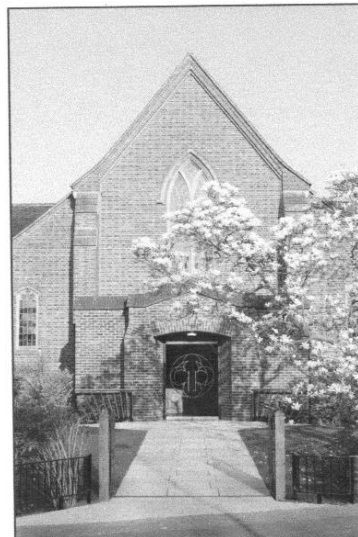

A Message from the Vicar

Dear Friends,

Today is my last Sunday (and Wednesday 1st August my last service) before I head-off on Sabbatical. Being a Vicar, tends to be an all-consuming life, and since ordination I have never been away from the Parish for more than two weeks. So... after nearly a decade and a half in full-time ordained ministry I am very grateful to have this opportunity to take time-out for further study and reflection as well as for rest and refreshment. I'll be taking one month's Annual Leave, taking some time to visit my mother and some friends here in the UK and then my allocated three months Sabbatical will be spent travelling, particularly to Nepal and elsewhere, with the benefit of a special round-the-world ticket.
